




Three Circles Model

Overlapping circles indicate interactions between aspects of animal welfare





To support dog welfare:

- Attend to physical health
- Attend to behavioral health
- Design environments to promote wellbeing









Provide:

- Opportunities to express rewarding behaviors (e.g., digging, chewing)
- Social housing and play sessions
- Positive interactions with human caretakers
- Low stress handling
- Enrichment items (e.g., toys, music, chew items)
- Reward-based training sessions

Meet Environmental Needs!

- Provide a complex environment (e.g., ramps, stairs, multiple flooring substrates)
- Minimize loud noises, aversive odors
- Maintain appropriate air quality, temperature, humidity
- Provide soft, dry resting area
- Provide access to fresh air, sunshine, natural substrates (e.g., grass, soil)




What Does Good Animal Welfare Look Like?





What does Poor Animal Welfare Look Like?

An animal who is:

- Suffering from pain, fear, or distress
- Diseased
- **Immunosuppressed**
- Physically wounded







- Impaired growth
- Reduced reproduction
- Behavior abnormalities



How is Animal Welfare Assessed?

- Physiological measures (e.g., stress hormones, immune function)
- Physical health measures (e.g., body condition, illness, injury, reproductive performance)
- Behavioral measures (e.g., fear, repetitive behaviors, play)

HINT: Assessing both positive and negative indicators is important






Welfare Assessments Should be:

- Rapid
- Accurate
- Objective
- Conducted regularly
